NOTES:

(1) The definition of which groups belong in the "Protestant" category was made by PROLADES based on information provided by the respective national census, and the statistics for the category of "Other" were modified accordingly.

(2) "Other religions" included a wide range of smaller religions: Mormons, Jehovah's Witnesses and other Marginal Christian groups. Non-Christian traditions included Hindus, Bahais, Chinese religions, as well as Black Muslim and Rastafarian communities among the Creole population. Official census categories, however, oversimplified religious identity in Belize. Some syncretistic beliefs and practices could easily be recognized. Many Garifuna for example, while nominally Roman Catholic, continue to uphold their traditional beliefs and practices, such as the *dugu* ritual, through which they honored their ancestors and perpetuated their distinctive Afro-Caribbean cultural identity. The Catholicism of many Mayans was similarly inflected with aspects of their own Amerindian cultural traditions. Among Creoles, the belief in Obeah, or witchcraft, has endured, particularly among the older generations of the urban and rural poor.
